Note:

1. Only the Advocates in the above listed matters will be allowed entry inside the Court Premises and/or Court Hall.
2. Parties/Litigants shall not be allowed in the Court premises, till further Orders.
3. All other matters listed on Today's Board will be adjourned by giving dates through bulk proceedings on the CIS, as it was done during the period of National Lockdown between April/May 2020. Advocates and Litigants are directed not to come to the Court for dates. They are advised to check the next dates given in their matters through the eCourts mobile application or by visiting the eCourts website.
4. In order to avoid overcrowding in the Court, the Members of the Bar are requested not to allow their Junior Advocates attached to their Chambers and/or their Clients to accompany them to the Court.
5. Entry in the Court Premises by members of the public and/or casual visitors and/or any other person(s) unconnected with any Court related work, is strictly prohibited. Any sort of disobedience in this regard may attract penal provisions.
6. All Advocates shall be allowed entry into the Court premises only after they wear face masks/face covering and only if they strictly adhere to the sanitizing measures which are put in place.
7. Each and every visitor (including Advocates and Staff Members) in the Court Premises are advised to download 'Aarogya Setu' App on their mobile phone handsets. They must further ensure that the Bluetooth on their mobile is switched on at all times.
8. While in the Court Premises, the Members of the Bar shall maintain social/physical distancing and follow other guidelines issued by the MHA, which have been displayed on the Notice Board.
9. Advocates may enter the Court Hall only once their matters have been called out for hearing before the Court. They are requested to leave the Court Hall and the Court Premises, immediately after they finish their matters.
10. In matters under Section 138 of the Negotiable Instruments Act, which are fixed for Verification, the personal presence of the Complainant/ Authorized Officer/ POA is not necessary. Orders will be passed based on the Affidavit and documents filed along with the complaint.
11. There will be no requirement of filing applications for personal exemption of the Complainant and/or Accused, in Criminal matters.
12. To avoid excess crowd in the Court Office/Registry, the Advocates are requested to ensure that the Affidavits and/or Verification of pleadings are duly affirmed, before a Notary.

13. Where parties have to file Statement on Oath (in Inventories) and/or Indemnity Bonds (in matters of release of property) and/or Consent Terms, the same shall be signed/ executed before a Notary.

14. In matters fixed for Final Arguments, the Advocates are encouraged to advance their oral submissions via Video Conference, within the time available.

15. A soft copy of this Cause List will be shared with the President of the Mapusa Advocates Forum, for further circulation amongst the Bar Members. No hard copy of the Board will be available in the Court Room.

16. Members of the Bar are requested to refrain from seeking inspection of the Court files.

17. No Lawyer will be allowed entry into the Court Premises and/or Court Hall for the purpose of oral mentioning. No oral mentioning will be permitted till further Orders. However if any matter is to be mentioned, the concerned Advocate shall send a *praecipe* to the Court by e-mail only, interalia setting out the short cause title, correct case number, the Court where the matter is allotted to, the mobile number and e-mail ID of the Advocate. The said contact details are required to be mentioned on the *praecipe* to enable the Court to respond to the same. Any clarification, if required by the Judge, will be obtained on Video Conference. For that purpose the Court will send a link for the said Video Conference to the said Advocate, by e-mail. It is made clear that any *praecipe* mentioning wrong case details and/or not containing the mobile number and/or e-mail ID of the Advocate, will not be entertained. 18. No Lawyer will be allowed in the Judges Chamber, for mentioning or for any other reason. Lawyers are hereby requested to refrain from making requests to meet the Judge.

19. Any meeting with the Judge, if found required, will be done through Video Conference. The same *praecipe* system is to be followed, if an appointment is being sought with the Judge. The *praecipe* shall set out, in brief, the reason why the meeting is being sought with the Judge.

20. If any Advocate and/or Litigant are found violating the above guidelines, we have been instructed to report the same to the Registrar, Inspection – I, Bombay High Court, in terms of our procedure. The Hon'ble High Court of Bombay has already informed that any violations of the norms may entail the closure of such Court by the Hon'ble High Court, till further Orders. Therefore Lawyers and Litigants are requested to co-operate with the Court, in our attempt to restart the daily Court proceedings, at the time of this pandemic, wherein our endeavor is to ensure that the Judges, Court Staff, Advocates and Litigants remain safe.

21. Accused who are in Judicial Custody must not be brought to the Court in view of COVID-19 pandemic. The Court will interact with the Accused in custody, through Video Conference.
